Dear NHBC Family

I want to begin by thanking you again for your help in getting us settled in our new home. Without your generous support, this would not have been possible. We are so very thankful for your support. In just a few days we are scheduled to move into our new house and we are very excited.

I have a question for you – are you really thankful? If you asked most people, especially people of faith, I would suspect that the answer would be a resounding - Yes! Of course, I am thankful – duh!

Ok, if that is the case, do you demonstrate your thankfulness? In our world, it seems much more likely that people are complaining than there are people openly expressing their thanks.

“Pollyanna” is a famous Disney movie from decades ago. In it, the main character – a pre-teen girl who grew up in a missionary family, displays a positive attitude and thankfulness for everything. She tells a story about requesting a doll as a present and getting excited when the missionary barrel arrived at her home. When the container was opened, there was no doll. Instead it contained crutches, which would seem to be a great disappointment. Pollyanna explained, however, that she played the Glad Game to find a reason to be thankful for what she received and she came up with being thankful that she didn’t need the crutches.

Do you play the Glad Game, finding things to be thankful for, or is your heart more likely to complain? Our human tendency, at least it seems in our culture, is to have high expectations and to be disappointed when we receive anything less. I have found it interesting that the people I have met who are the most truly thankful are those who do not have a lot of worldly goods. Many of them will brag about how God always provides, but by our standards they live in poverty. Is it possible to be thankful in poverty?

Is it possible that the people who have the most, those who are most blessed, tend to be the very people who are quick to complain and slow to be thankful? While we have so much to be thankful for, I think it is easy to get distracted away from those blessings we have and focus our hearts on the things we still want.

So, during this time that we remember a thankful group of early settlers who had gone through a devastating year in what was then a wilderness, may we reflect within ourselves and make sure that we are people of thanks.

Again, I want you to know I am thankful for you and for the opportunity I have to be with you – my church family.

Prayer Thoughts

Are You Using Prayer to Prepare Your Daily Living? —With Great Confidence?

Consider: Acts 2:1—When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. Prayer does not give you spiritual power. Prayer aligns your life with God so that He chooses to demonstrate His power through you. The purpose of prayer is not to convince God to change your circumstances but to prepare you to be involved in God's activity. The fervent prayer of the people at Pentecost did not induce the Holy Spirit to come upon them. Prayer brought them to a place where they were ready to participate in the mighty work God had already planned. Jesus told His followers to remain in Jerusalem until the Spirit came upon them (Acts 1:4–5). The disciples obeyed His command, waiting for God's next directive. As they prayed, God adjusted their lives to what He intended to do next. As they prayed, a unity developed among them. For the first time the disciples used Scripture as their guide in decision-making (Acts 1:15–26). The day of Pentecost arrived, and the city of Jerusalem filled with pilgrims from around the world. When God released His Holy Spirit upon the disciples, He had already filled the city with messengers who would carry the gospel to every nation. Prayer had prepared the disciples for their obedient response. Prayer is designed to adjust you to God's will, not to adjust God to your will. If God has not responded to what you are praying, you may need to adjust your praying to align with God's agenda. Rather than focusing on what you would like to see happen, realize that God may be more concerned with what He wants to see happen in you.

Examine: 1 John 5:14-15 - Focuses on the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us — whatever we ask — we know that we have what we asked of Him.

Throughout the Scriptures, we are encouraged to pray. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells His disciples to keep asking, seeking, and knocking while trusting the Heavenly Father to give what is good to His children (Matt. 7:7-11). And in Philippians 4:6, Paul urges us to respond to anxiety by praying about everything. Therefore, it's obvious that God wants us to come to Him with all our needs and concerns. This passage assures us that the Lord hears and answers our prayers. However, this promise is accompanied by one very important stipulation: We must ask according to His will. But how can we know whether our request is what He desires? Much of God's will is clearly revealed in Scripture, but what are we to do when an issue is not directly addressed in the Bible? Though we'd like to feel confident that the Lord will hear and answer, at times our prayers seem like shots in the dark because we have no idea whether they align with His will. If we dare to admit it, there are also times when we just want God to do what we ask, without regard to what He desires.

If we want to pray effectively, our goal should not be to offer up quick, thoughtless, or self-willed prayers in hopes of receiving speedy answers. Instead, we must learn to pray wisely and wait patiently. Along with voicing our concerns and requests to God, we should also offer ourselves up in submission to our Father, as Jesus did in Gethsemane (Matt. 26:39). When we are yielded and obedient to the Lord, His Spirit guides us and provides the wisdom we need in order to pray according to His will.
